Still have an issue with #2 Rabbit Thrower but I am talking with the tech at Lincoln as well as the tech who repairs the throwers at Hill n Dale to work out a solution.

The Wobbler thrower is being moved to Station 1 so we can shoot a few different programs as well for 5 Stand.

The plan next year is to see about getting the wireless remote up and running. I still need someone who can help me wire this up. I like to see about adding another launcher or two.

There is also interest to use the range for another type of clay shooting game Crazy Quails which if it goes forward will address the issue of getting more traps. We would be able to run either shooting game from this range. It will add more challenges to the course.

I am proposing running official 5 stand shoots on Weds nights (League if anyone is interested) and on a few Saturdays. I also thinking of doing a Halloween shoot which we shoot at different targets and course. More on that later. I am planning on a training session for the Trap crew to run the course.

### **Lake Report**

The ultimate purpose of the NLFGC Lake is to have a pleasant body of water where members can catch fish! Sounds simple, right?.....It's never that easy! Of course any objective can be viewed as a series of steps to achieve the goal. In this case it begins with interested member volunteers getting together to work towards this goal. Beginning in August a group got together to inspect, fix and upgrade the Lake aeration system. Thank You Neal Kelley for bringing your boat to the lake, we raised and inspected the three diffusers and discovered all three were in dire need of maintenance. We cleaned off the muck, replaced one diffuser, replaced the floats and lines, and repaired a hole in one of the supply lines. Thank You Gary Parsons for "taking one for the team" with two boots full of cold lake water completing the line repair! We also overhauled the air pump and added three flow meters and a pressure gage. Now everything is functional and we can monitor the system to prevent a fish kill when the lake

freezes over this winter. You might also notice the lake level lower than normal, we are dropping the level about 2 feet to prevent shoreline ice damage his winter. Thank You Frank Burkett for the assistance and historical background information to understand the inlet and outlet valves for us newbies!

Our next task will be to treat the lake in the spring to prevent algae blooms and although some weeds are good, harmful weeds can overgrow the lake. Algae can consume all the oxygen and cause a fish kill. Kevan Crouse is heading up this effort and is contacting several contractors to generate treatment plans and quotes for this service.

Finally the prime objective is FISH! The club has not stocked the lake with any fish fingerlings since 2016. We are planning to stock the lake in the spring using guidelines from the Ohio Department of Natural Resources OHIO POND MANAGEMENT HANDBOOK. We are also working with Mark McKean to explore the possibility of getting grants to either help or completely fund the Lake stocking program. The grant requests will present our plans for the NLFGC Youth Day and Learning Day activities at the lake. We need member fishermen volunteers for these noble efforts in the spring. Any member who would like to teach kids how to fish, please let us know! Contact Dennis Earl for details, times and plans for these activities!

Additionally, long term plans include the addition of a dock to gain better access to the lake and make fishing more fun. The Club was endowed with a very generous donation from the late Veryl Turskey earmarked to provide the funds necessary to build a dock. Please remember Veryl with a prayer, he passed away on November 17, 2017. We need a special dedicated volunteer to facilitate this activity and fulfill Veryl's vision. Any member who would like to take on this task, please let us know!

### **Ohio Election Results...**

The 2<sup>nd</sup> Amendment was a big winner for Ohio elections. The state officials that were elected were all pro-gun: Dewine/Husted, Governor and Lieutenant Governor; Dave Yost, Attorney General, Frank LaRose, Secretary of State; Keith Faber, Auditor of State; Robert Sprague, Treasurer of State.

The Ohio House of Representatives was won by a majority of pro-gun candidates with only a few losses to anti-gun candidates. The Ohio House sustains its super majority of pro-gun candidates representing 85% of the House of Representatives.

The Ohio Senate defended every open seat and added one additional seat with pro-gun candidates.

The only losses for Ohio gun owners were the two Ohio Supreme Court Justices that were not recommended by Buckeye Firearms. Sherrod Brown a U.S. Senate candidate, an incumbent and anti-gun, was re-elected to the Senate.

In addition, Anthony Gonzales who is pro-gun won his race for Ohio's 16<sup>th</sup> district in the U.S. House of Representatives. Troy Balderson (pro-gun) won his first election to the U.S. House of Representatives.

### **Ohio Gun Legislation...**

The Ohio House has passed HB 228 that requires the prosecution to prove an illegal use of a firearm in a case of self-defense. The Senate will need to ratify and be signed by the Governor. Current law has been that the gun owner had to prove that he/she used their firearm legally for self-defense, which totally conflates with the principle of “innocent till proven guilty”.

Of interest is the following text in the bill:

“The general assembly also finds and declares that it is proper for law-abiding people to protect themselves, their families, and others from intruders and attackers without fear of prosecution or civil action for acting in defense of themselves or others.”

Other components of the bill include:

- Expands the locations at which a person has no duty to retreat before using force under both civil and criminal law.

- Eliminates the requirement for license holders to carry a second form of ID while in possession of a firearm.

- Adds a requirement for licensees to keep the licensee's hands in plain sight “unless impractical”.

- Repeals the required posting of warning signs regarding the possession of weapons on specified premises that allow conceal carry.

- Increased penalties for people illegally buying a gun to sell to a prohibited person.

- Excludes certain firearms from the definition of sawed-off firearms.

- Provides for a safe harbor for a spouse or other unlicensed individual driving a car that another person has left a firearm in.

### **Ohio Supreme Court Change to Rules of Superintendence**

The Ohio Supreme Court has proposed amendments to the Rules of Superintendence for the Courts of Ohio that will empower law enforcement to seize guns. Many of these changes usurp the role of elected lawmakers and represent the most significant changes to Ohio law of our time.

The Ohio Supreme Court has proposed rule changes that would disarm and force those sub-

ject to a civil protection order to surrender firearms, ammunition, and concealed handgun license to law enforcement. This seizure would take place even if there is no evidence that a firearm was threatened to be used, used, or brandished.

If passed and adopted as they are currently written, the amendments will empower authorities to:

Seize guns, ammo, and concealed handgun license, requiring a separate legal action to be filed within 30 days for return of the property and no clear policy for returning or reinstating the license. (Guilty until proven innocent ??)

Dispose of guns and ammo as unclaimed property upon expiration of the protection order.

Create a registry of all firearms owned by the gun owner by repeatedly asking for an inventory of firearms owned or possessed throughout proposed forms.

Infringe on the 2nd and 5th Amendments of the U.S. Constitution.

Ignore the Ohio Constitution and court decisions on matters of civil protection orders.

Usurp the power reserved exclusively for the Ohio General Assembly to create new laws.

### HOW THE PROCESS WORKS

The Supreme Court drafts proposed rule changes. The proposed rule changes are put out for public comment. Then the Supreme Court reviews the comments and meets to make decisions on the final draft of the rules.

The Supreme Court then votes on its new rule changes, and once passed, they move on to the Ohio General Assembly.

According to the Ohio Constitution, the amendments must be submitted to the General Assembly by Jan. 15, and the Court has until April 30 to make any revisions and file the amendments. Unless the General Assembly adopts a concurrent resolution of disapproval before July 1, the amendments take effect on that date.

Based on historical precedent, it is highly unlikely that the General Assembly will interfere with rule changes coming from the Ohio Supreme Court.

### Update

Buckeye Firearms petitioned its members to call and send email in opposition to the proposed rules change during the time for public comment. Patriot supporters for the second amendment shut down the court's phone lines and crashed their computers with opposing comments. Buckeye Firearms has recently talked to two of the Ohio Supreme Court Justices who were surprised by the volume of comment and expressed their desire to fix the problem that they created...stay tuned.
